So Alex Norton		To all to whom these presents shall come. I O. H. Latimer of Greenville District in the State aforesaid send greeting

Whenas I the said O. H. Latimer am indebted to Alexander Norton of Greenville District in the State aforesaid by a certain note of hand due June the 8th 1860 for the sum of four hundred and eighty five dollars and forty nine cents under seal. Now know ye that I the said O. H. Latimer for the better securing the payment of the said debt and sum of four hundred and eighty five dollars & 49/100 payable unto the said Alexander Norton his executors administrators or assigns together with lawful interest for the same have bargained and sold and by these presents do bargain and sell and in plain and open market deliver unto the said Alexander Norton one negro woman named Catherine about seventeen years old and her boy child named Henry about seven months old to have and to hold the said negro woman Catherine and her boy child named Henry unto the said Alexander Norton his heirs executors administrators and assigns forever. Bonded always nevertheless that if the said O. H. Latimer his heirs executors administrators or assigns shall and do well and truly pay or cause to be paid unto the said Alexander Norton his certain attorney executors administrators or assigns the full and just sum of four hundred and eighty five dollars & 49/100 according to the true intent and meaning of the parties aforesaid and of these presents together with lawful interest then this deed of bargain and sale and all and every clause article and thing therein contained shall cease determine and be utterly void and of none effect any thing herein contained to the contrary thereof notwithstanding and it is hereby declared by and between the said parties and the said O. H. Latimer his executors administrators and assigns do covenant promise and agree to and with the said Alexander Norton his executors administrators and assigns by these presents that if default shall happen to be made of the said sum of four hundred and eighty five dollars & 49/100 as aforesaid according to the true intent

and meaning of the parties aforesaid that then and in such case it shall and may be lawful to and for the said Alexander Norton his executors administrators attorney or agents from time to time at all times hereafter peaceably and quietly to enter into any or all the messuages lands or tenements of the said O. H. Latimer and to take the said slaves before mentioned into his custody and possession, and the same to hold and detain to his own use and behoof, as his own proper goods and chattels from henceforth and forever, or the same to sell and to dispose of at will and pleasure, returning the overplus if any should happen to be after paying the said sum of four hundred and eighty five dollars and forty nine cents unto the said O. H. Latimer his executors administrators and assigns. In witness whereof I the said O. H. Latimer have hereunto set my hand and seal this eight day of June in the year of our Lord one thousand eight hundred and sixty and of the sovereignty and independence of the United States of America the Eighty fourth Signed sealed and delivered in the presence of
