926 Marcus R Barton Deed To Curtis Bradley Trust The State of South Carolina Greenville District Know all men by these presents that I Marcus R Barton of the State and District aforesaid being the owner of a certain slave named Lewis aged about twenty three years, and being desirous of securing the ~~benefit~~ or his arising from said slave to my own use as a means of support for my self and being also desirous of protecting my self against being depraived out of the said slave, or against my selling him without sufficient considerations and having full confidence in the skill and integrity of Curtis Bradley of the District and State aforesaid in consideration of the premises aforesaid, and of the sum of Five dollars to me paid by the said Curtis Bradley I have bargained sold and delivered and by these presents I do hereby bargain sell and deliver unto the said Curtis Bradley the said slave Lewis, to have and to hold the said slave Lewis unto the said Curtis Bradley his executors administrators and assigns but only upon the following trusts and conditions

and for the following uses and purposes, and for and upon no other use purpose trust or condition whatever, that is to say In trust to have hold and possess the said slave Lewis for the special use and benefit of the said Marcus R Barton and to suffer him the said Marcus R Barton to have receive and enjoy the profits income and hire of the said slave Lewis to his own proper use and behoof, but the legal title to be in the said Curtis Bradley free from the contracts and sale of the said Marcus R Barton, and in trust further that if shall become desirable hereafter from any cause to make sale of the said slave Lewis and to change the said trust in vestment such sale and change of investment may be made by the said Curtis Bradley, in such manner as may be agreed upon in writing by the said parties without applying to the Court of Equity for this purpose and such future investment shall always be held by the said Curtis Bradley in the same manner and upon the same uses trusts and conditions as provided for in this deed
