

Joseph Barton Deed South Carolina
 To Nancy Pace For Land Greenville District
 Know all Men by these presents
 that I Joseph Barton of the
 State and District aforesaid for the Love I have for my
 daughter Nancy Pace, I give and bequeath unto her
 a certain tract or parcel of land containing twenty two
 acres situate lying and being in the State and District
 aforesaid on the south east fork of Tyger river beginning
 on a red oak a corner of a tract of land granted to Bearden
 running South $9\frac{1}{4}$ & 11.80 links to a stone thence $S 61\frac{1}{4}$ $W 23$
 17 links to a stone on William Bates line thence $N 24\frac{1}{2}$ West $5.$
 63 links to a stone on same line thence $N 51\frac{1}{4}$ & 15.90 links
 to a black oak bush thence $47\frac{1}{2}$ & 10.75 links to the beginning
 it being a part of a tract of land granted to Benjamin Barton
 generally known as the dark holler tract for which the
 said Nancy Pace is to account for one hundred and eighty
 seven dollars when a distribution is made after the death of
 my self and wife Lettuce Barton, together with all and singular
 the rights members hereditaments and appurtenances to have and
 to hold, ^{all} and singular the premises before mentioned unto the said
 Nancy Pace her heirs and assigns for ever and I do hereby
 bind my self my heirs executors and administrators to warrant and
 for ever defend all and singular the said premises unto the said
 Nancy Pace wife of Richard H Pace her heirs and assigns
 against my self my heirs and assigns and against every other
 person or persons whosoever lawfully claiming or to claim the
 same or any part thereof
