 So For This indenture made the fourth
 C. P. Dill Land day of May in the year of our
 Lord one thousand eight hundred
 and sixty three between William M Thomas Esquire
 Commissioner of the Honorable Court of Equity for Greenville
 District at Greenville Court House in the State of the one
 part and C P Dill of the other part. Whereas Georgia
 Turpin on or about the Twenty third day of March in the
 year of our Lord one thousand eight hundred and sixty
 three exhibited her bill of complaint in the court of Equity
 at Greenville Court House in the said State against Anna
 M A Turpin and others for the partition of the lands of Joseph
 M A Turpin deceased, and the cause being at issue before
 the Honorable Court came on to be heard at Chambers in the
 year of our Lord one thousand eight hundred and sixty three
 when the said Court after full hearing thereof and mature delibera-
 tion in the premises did order ad judge and decree that
 said land should be sold at Public Auction by the Commissioners
 of the said Court on the terms and for the purposes mentioned
 in their decretal order as by reference thereto in the registry
 of the said Court will appear, and the said William M Thomas
 as Commissioner of the said Court after having duly adverti-
 sed the said Land for sale by Public Auction on the fourth day
 of May in the year of our Lord one thousand eight hundred and
 sixty three did there openly and publicly and according to the custom
 of Auctions sell and dispose of the said Land before described unto
 the said C Pinckney Dill for one thousand and five dollars being
 at that price the highest bidder for the same. Now therefore
 this indenture witnesseth that the said William M Thomas as
 Commissioner of the said Court under and by virtue of the said
 Decree and in consideration of the sum of three dollars paid him
 by the said C Pinckney Dill the receipt whereof is hereby acknow-
 ledged hath granted bargained sold and released, and by these
 presents doth grant bargain sell and release unto the said C P Dill
 and his heirs and assigns all that tract or parcel of land situated
 lying and being in Greenville District on Waters of Enore River
 containing three hundred and fifty two acres more particularly
 described in Book E page 608 and 609 of the office of Recorder
 of Meigs County for Greenville District excepting a small piece
 of four and one half acres conveyed by J M A Turpin to Brew B
 Benson in deed dated 10th day of August A D 1860 recorded on
 page 79 of Book 3rd in the office of Recorder of Meigs County
 for Greenville District. Together with all and singular the hereditaments
 rights members and appurtenances whatsoever to the said Land
 belonging or in anywise appertaining, and the reversions and
 remainders rents Issues and Profits thereof, and also all the Estate
 right title Interest Power possession property benefit claim and
 demand whatsoever, both at Law and Equity of the heirs and
 representatives of the said Joseph M A Turpin deceased and of
 the parties to this suit and of all other persons rightfully claiming
