Now therefore to have and keep firm and hold the said Canble very surety on said Note, I do hereby grant bargain sell and release unto the said Peter Canble said Peter known and described as follows, boy color and about ten years old and the same horse purchased by said Grogan from one Miles Watson some four years ago, the said Spruence also bargain and sell in addition to the horse above described and for the purpose and in consideration above of his suretyship above mentioned a certain red cow the same that the said Spruence purchased some three years since from Alexander Norton to have and to hold the said horse and cow unto the said Canble his heirs, executors, administrators and assigns and against me my heirs, executors, administrators and assigns or any other person lawfully claiming the same. It is the true intent of the parties to these presents that if the said Spruence pay or cause to be paid unto the said Grogan the sum of One Hundred and dollars and interest and save the said Canble harmless in the payment of the same or any part thereof then these presents shall be utterly null and void. It is further the intent of these presents until default shall be made in payment of the sum aforesaid it may be lawful for the said Spruence peaceably and quietly to hold use possess and enjoy the sum of the said Charles above mentioned.
