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This Indenture made the first day of February in the year of our Lord one thousand eight hundred and sixty six between James P. Moore Esquire Commissioner of the Honorable Court of Equity for Greenville District of Greenville County South Carolina in the said State of the one part and Prudence Dill widow of George Dill dec'd. or agent the eighteenth day of January in the year of our Lord one thousand eight hundred and sixty six exhibited her bill of complaint in the Court of Equity at Greenville Court House in the said State against James Ross Et al. And the cause being at issue before the Honorable Court came on to be heard at Chambers in the year of our Lord one thousand eight hundred and sixty six when the said Court after full hearing heard and taken deliberation in the premises did order adjudge and decree that the Real Estate of George Dill dec'd. descended in the Bill should be divided and assigned amongst the parties in interest according to the division and assignment recommended by the Commissioners in partition, and whereas the said Commissioners in partition did assign to Prudence Dill the widow of George Dill deceased lot No 1. Containing one hundred and forty four acres more or less and valued at twenty one hundred and thirty dollars Now therefore this indenture witnesseth that the said James P. Moore Esq. as Commissioner of the said Court under and by virtue of the said decree and in consideration of the sum of three dollars paid him by the said Prudence Dill the receipt whereof is hereby acknowledged hath granted bargained sold and released and by these presents doth grant bargain sell and release unto the said Prudence Dill her heirs and assigns all that lot or tract of land situate in Greenville District and State aforesaid on both sides of White Cat Creek beginning at Stone 54 N 16 1/4 E 57 to Stone 54 N 73 1/4 W 28 50 to Stone 54 N thence S 16 1/4 W 50 to Stone 54 in bottom thence S 73 1/4 E 28 50 to the beginning corner and containing one hundred and forty four acres more or less as per plat of James H. Dickson Jr her attached, together with all and singular the hereditaments rights members and appurtenances whatsoever to the said Land belonging or in anywise appertaining and the revenues and remainders rents issues and profits thereof and also all the estate right title interest down possession benefit claim and demand whatsoever both at law and in equity of the heirs and representatives of the said George Dill deceased and of the parties to this suit and of all other persons rightfully claiming or to claim the same or any part thereof by from or under them or either of them to have and to hold the said Land with its hereditaments privileges and appurtenances unto the said Prudence Dill her heirs and assigns to her and their only proper use benefit and behoof forever In witness whereof the said James P.
