Now know all men by these presents that I Martha Loveland of Greenville District in the State aforesaid, for and in consideration of the premises aforesaid, the said John Watson having delivered to me the Mortgage and the said Note aforesaid have granted bargained sold and released and by these presents do grant bargain sell and release and by these presents do grant bargain sell and release unto the said John Watson all that piece parcel and tract of Land Situate lying and being in Greenville District and State of South Carolina and having the following lines, to wit: and bounds, by, beginning at a W. C. St. on the bank of Saluda River thence S 70 E 87 chs to a Blk. C. St. thence S 20 W 4.50 chs to a Blk. St. thence N 70 E 34 chs to a Blk. St. thence N 21 E 3.70 chs to a Blk. Stump 34 pointers thence S 69 E 4 chs to a Note 34 thence N 22 E 37 chs to a line 34 on Mill Creek and old Mill Pond, thence by said creek about 3 chs to a stake below Shoar where mill house formerly stood, thence N 22 E 3.50 chs to a large chestnut 34 thence N 70 W 33 chs to a stake 34 thence N 40 E 7 chs to a stake by a W. O. on a creek thence down said creek and ditch to a stake 34 thence S 33 W 21.40 chs to a stake on Saluda River above the mouth of Mill Creek, thence down said River to the beginning corner. The said tract containing One hundred and thirty five Acre, and being the same tract conveyed to me as Trustee for Drucilla S.
