 of Congress entitled Feb 27th 1867 to establish a uniform system
 of Bankruptcy throughout the United States approved
 March 3rd 1867 do hereby convey and assign to the said
 William S. Sumate assignee as aforesaid all the estate
 real and personal of the said John Anderson Bankrupt
 aforesaid including all the property of whatever kind
 of which he was possessed or in which he was interested
 or entitled to have on the 31st day of March 1868 with all
 books and papers relating thereto excepting such
 property as is exempted from the operation of this assign-
 ment by the provisions of the said Fourteenth Section
 of said Act to have and to hold all the foregoing
 premises to the said W. S. Sumate his heirs forever
 in Trust nevertheless for the use and purpose with the
 powers and subject to the conditions and limitations

 E 29 chains and 86 links to a stone in the Road thence S 62 E
 to the Creek thence up the meanders of the creek to the ford thence
 E with the conditional line between Mary Gosnell and
 James Gosnell to the maple the beginning corner containing fifty
 Acres to this same meow or less to have and to hold the above
 granted premises together with all and singular the rights
 members hereditaments appurtenances and I the said
 James Gosnell for here by bind myself my heirs Executors Ad-
 ministrators and Assigns for ever to warrant and the above
