Gibson in the said marriage settlement recorded in the office of Secretary of State in Columbia South Carolina Miscellaneous Record Book C & Page 18 and of office of Register of Merit County area for Greenville District and State aforesaid in Book 7 Page 702. 9034904 on the 26th day of December A.D. 1864. The true intent of this instrument being to testify all whom it may concern that I have and had said property aforesaid as herein before particular only set forth. In testimony whereof I have hereunto set my hand and seal this the twenty third day of June A.D. eighteen hundred and sixty eight signed sealed and delivered in presence of R. Furman Whelden & William J. Gibson & Alfred Taylor W. G. D.

John P. Shockley	Land	This indenture made the fourteenth day of February in the year of our Lord one thousand eight hundred & sixty between William M. Thomas Esq. Commissioner of the Honorable Court of Equity for Greenville District at Greenville Court House in the said State of the one part and John P. Shockley of the other part. Whereas John Benedict et al. on or about the first day of March in the year of our Lord one thousand eight hundred and fifty six exhibited their Bill of Complaint in the Court of Equity at Greenville Court House in the said State against Samuel M. Benedict and Thomas G. Benedict for the partition and sale of the lands of S. M. Benedict deceased. And the cause being at issue before the Honorable Court came on to be heard at July Term in the year of our Lord one thousand eight hundred and fifty six when the said Court after full hearing thereof and mature deliberation in the premises did order adjudge and decree that the said lands should be sold at public auction

by the Commissioner of the said Court on the terms and for the purpose mentioned in the aforesaid Order as by reference thereto in the Registry of the said Court will appear and the Samuel A. Jordan as Commissioner of the said Court after having duly advertised the said lands for sale by Public outcry on the sales day of September in the year of our Lord one thousand eight hundred and fifty six did then openly and public-ly and according to the Customs of Auctioneers sell and dispose of the said lands below described unto the said John P. Shockley for one hundred and fifty one dollars being at that price the highest bidder for the same. And therefore this indenture witnesses that the said William M. Thomas as Commissioner of the said Court under and by virtue of the said Decree and in consideration of the sum of three dollars paid him by the said John P. Shockley the Receipt whereof is hereby acknowledged hath granted bargained sold and released and by these presents doth grant bargain sell and release unto the said John P. Shockley and his Heirs and Assigns all that tract of land situate on waters of Brushy Creek commencing on poplar 3x3x on on small branch, thence N. 35 1/4 W. 11.70 N. to black oak 3x3x on on thence S. 54. W. 22.30 chains to Rock 3x3x on on small branch thence N. 85. E. 18.43. chains to a Pine 3x3x on on thence N. 48 1/2 E. 6.25 chains to beginning Poplar 3x containing nineteen and a quarter acres more or less together with all and singular the Hereditaments, Rights, Members and Appurtenances whatsoever, to the said Land belonging, or in anywise appertaining; and the Reversions and Remainders, Rents, Issues, and Profits thereof; and also all the Estate, Right, Title, Interest, Dower, Possession, Property, Benefit Claim, and Demand whatsoever, both at Law and in Equity, of the Heirs and Representatives of the said J. A. Benedict and of the parties to this suit, and of all other persons rightfully claiming, or to claim the same, or any part thereof, by, from, or under them, or either of them, to Have and to Hold the said Land with its Hereditaments, Privileges and Appurtenances, unto the said John P. Shockley and his Heirs and assigns, to his and their only proper use, benefit, and behoof forever. In Witness whereof the said Wm. M.
