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Know all men by these presents that Jesse C. Kelgon of this District for and in consideration of the sum of One dollar to me in hand paid to me whenof is hereby acknowledged and also for the purposes below stated do hereby give grant and convey to Adam Weir James Valentine and the other members of the church below described the right and privilege of those acres of land situate on the Greenville Road in this District near the thirteen mile post in the vicinity of the residence of Jesse C. Kelgon surrounded by lands of said Jesse C. Kelgon for the purpose of building thereon a church for the coloured people the said Weir Valentine and other members an also to have the right of getting the timber for putting up their improvements from the land of said Jesse C. Kelgon. They are to continue to have the use and possession of said land as long as they conduct their meetings in said church in a good and orderly manner. That upon any thing occurring to the contrary the said land is to revert to me and my heirs. So have and to hold said land to them and their successors under the above limitations forever. In testimony whereof I have hereunto set my hand and seal on the 18th day of June in the year of our Lord one thousand eight hundred and sixty eight.
