 and daughter of one Nathan Berry deceased of Green-
 ville District in the State aforesaid in consideration of the
 sum of three thousand dollars paid to the administrators of
 the said Nathan Berry deceased by one Micajah Berry late
 of Greenville District the distribution of which we
 have received and in consideration of the sum of one dollar
 to us paid by James Harrison the receipt whereof is hereby
 acknowledged, have granted bargained sold and released
 by these presents do grant bargain sell and release unto the said
 James Harrison all our undivided interest right title and
 estate in three several tracts of land bequeathed by the late
 Hudson Berry to William Berry Micajah Berry and the
 said Nathan Berry, containing six hundred and twenty five
 acres more or less situate on the Cedar Falls place and part
 of three tracts and purchased by Hudson Berry from
 Micajah West and from John A. Smith and one from
 William Arnold all adjoining and lying in the
 State and district aforesaid. Together with all and
 singular the Rights Members Hereditaments and Appur-
 tenances belonging or in any wise incident or appertain-
 ing. So have we to hold sell and singular the premises
 before mentioned unto the said James Harrison his heirs
 and assigns forever. And we do hereby bind ourselves
 our heirs Executors and Administrators to warrant
 and forever defend all and singular the said prem-
 is unto the said James Harrison his heirs and
 assigns against us and our heirs and every other
 person whomsoever lawfully claiming or to claim the
 said or any part thereof. Witness our hands and seals

 one thousand eight hundred and sixty six and in

 May 1866 assigned by myself & J. Taylor security, also a note given in
 favor of W. H. Kinney Sr for seven dollars or thereabouts due August
 1864, also a note given in favor of Oliver Barrett for twenty five dollars
 due 25th of Sept 1866 all of which notes is assigned by myself Joel
 Youngblood & J. Taylor security, and to secure the payment of which notes
 I have granted bargained sold and delivered unto the said J. Taylor
 the following property, to wit one pole of Oxen, two heifers, one ox, wagon
 six head of hogs one large kettle fifty bushels corn three hundred pounds
 of bacon and by these presents do grant bargain sell & release unto the
 said J. Taylor his heirs or assigns the property before mentioned. So have
 and to hold forever, and I do hereby warrant & forever defend all and singu-
 lar the said property unto the said J. Taylor his heirs or assigns against
 me and my heirs Executors Administrators or assigns forever. The condition
 of this obligation is such that if the said Joel Youngblood shall pay the said
 notes or cause the same to be done with interest then the above obli-
 gation to be null and void otherwise it will remain in full force and virtue
 and in default of the payment of the said notes it shall be lawful for the
 said J. Taylor to levy and possess or sell so much of the said property
 as will satisfy & pay the said notes with interest & the costs that may be
 created thereby in testimony whereof I have hereunto set my hand & seal
