 This Contract
 made and Entered into by Moses McCoy on the one
 part and by M.D. Bramlett on the other part witnesses that
 Moses McCoy has agreed with said Bramlett to give him
 the use and rent of all his land for the term of his natural
 life and of the life of his wife Catherine McCoy with
 following conditions said Bramlett agrees to support
 said Moses McCoy and his wife close their door there
 pay the taxes on the property said McCoy and wife
 to reside in Bramlett's home and the said Moses
 McCoy give said Bramlett the full use and control
 of said land with all the profits arising from the
 use of the same with power to clear fences or alter whosoever
 to him may seem fit and said Moses McCoy further
 gives unto William D. Bramlett the use and the rent of
 the one hundred and twenty four acres of land by him
 held to the two daughters of Jesse L. McCoy deceased
 until they are twenty one year of age even though he
 and his wife shall both be deceased before that time
 given under our hands and Seal this 3rd day of March A.D. 1871
