 James Harrison of the State and County aforesaid  
 have this day made a division of that tract  
 or parcel of land deeded to us by Jacob Ponder  
 known as the George Russell tract situated in County  
 and State aforesaid on the north side of Pacific  
 Coast the west end of said tract bounded by  
 lands of Wilson and Ballinger James Hoversold  
 and others also we hereby relinquish to each other  
 our right titles and claims in the separate parcels  
 or lots of said lands namely I William Harrison  
 do hereby relinquish unto the said James Harrison  
 all my right titles and claims in that part  
 or lot No 1 containing one hundred and eighty  
 two acres more or less beginning on a poplar  
 on Pacific coast three acres the west end of the  
 creek to the mouth of the Branch that comes from  
 Merriam Fleming thence up the Branch to a white  
 oak thence nearly North to a rock corner thence  
 nearly North of east to a chestnut thence nearly  
 east to a red oak thence to a pine on Wilson  
 and Ballinger Spring Branch thence the conventional  
 line down the Branch to the mouth at the Still  
 House Branch thence to a rock forty nine steps  
 east of the waggon road leading from James  
 Harrison to his old place thence to a pine  
 corner thence to a poplar beginning together  
 with all and singular the right titles  
 Hereditaments and appurtenances to said  
 premises belonging or in any wise pertaining  
 and I do hereby bind myself my heirs executors
