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John P. Shockley Deed
The State of South Carolina Know all men by these presents that I John P. Shockley of Greenville County in the State of South Carolina for and in consideration of four hundred dollars to me paid by J. H. Fleming of Greenville County in the State of South Carolina Grant Bargain and sell and release unto the said J. H. Fleming a certain tract or parcel of land situated in Greenville County in a State adjacent on the North side of South River above Elmore Bridge Beginning at the said Bridge and runs up South to the river to a Poplar 31 and runs N 4 E 70 S to a stone 31 at a ditch fence up said ditch N 77 W 14 1/2 to a land thence S 72 E 31 1/4 to a land thence N 24 W 2 1/2 to a stone 31 thence N 27 W E 26 3 to a stone 31 thence S 75 E 33 3 to a stone 31 in the center of the Greenville & Northford Road thence along said road to the said bridge the Beginning corner containing fifty two acres more or less also one other tract Situate in Greenville County and State of South Carolina between the Saluda Gap Road and the Northford Road Beginning at a Stone 31 on the Saluda Gap Road John M. Dickson corner and runs with his line to a stake in the Northford and Greenville Road thence along said road to where the Maye road crosses thence along said Maye Road to the Saluda Gap Road thence along said road to the Beginning containing fifty one acre more or less together with all and singular the rights Members Hereditaments and appurtenances to the said premises belonging or in any wise incident or appertaining To have and to hold all and singular the premises before mentioned unto the said J. H. Fleming his heirs and assigns forever and I do hereby bind myself my heirs executors and administrators to warrant and forever defend all and singular the said premises unto the said J. H. Fleming his heirs and assigns against me and my heirs and every other person whomsoever lawfully claiming or to claim the same on any part thereof Witness my hand and seal this eleventh day of November in the year of our Lord one thousand eight hundred and seventy three and in the seventh year of the Independence of the United States of America

Jones all that tract or parcel of Land Situate lying and being in Greenville County in a State adjacent a land part of the tract where I now live Beginning at a Large Black Oak dead and decayed and runs thence S 37 1/2 E 22 35 to a stake 31 thence S 70 W 22 93 to a stake 31 thence N 44 W 25 75 to a small Black oak 31 thence S 17 1/4 E 25 53 to the Beginning containing fifty one and 1/2 length acres more or less together with all and singular the rights Members Hereditaments and appurtenances to the said premises
