Trust Deed State of South Carolina To all whom these presents shall come or be made known or whom the same may in any wise concern I William A M Daniel Clerk of the Court of Common Pleas in and for the County of Greenville and State aforesaid send greeting: Whereas on the eighteenth day of May One thousand eight hundred and seventy four Emma M Westfield and Whitner Symmes as Plaintiffs exhibited their complaint in the Court of Common Pleas for the County and State aforesaid against Thomas M Cox Thomas C Gower Mary Westfield John O Westfield William Binie Caroline Binie Mary Binie James Binie Jennette Binie Defendants, wherein amongst other things it was set forth that the said Whitner Symmes Thomas M Cox Thomas C Gower one John Westfield since deceased and one James Binie also since deceased jointly owned sundry pieces parcels or lots of land situate in and near the City of Greenville in the County and State aforesaid and in the life time of said deceased persons had entered into a parol agreement to convey the said lands to certain persons as trustees who should hold sell and convey the same for the benefit of the parties interested; and amongst other things it was in substance prayed that the said agreement might be executed a trustee or trustees appointed to whom the said lands might be conveyed under such deed as might be directed by said Court And whereas upon the hearing of said cause on the seventeenth day June A D 1874 the several matters and things contained in said complaint were referred to J B Whitner Special Referee to report upon the same and whereas upon the coming in of the report of said Special Referee the said cause being ready for a further hearing came on to be heard at Chambers on the seventh day of August A D 1874 when after a full hearing thereof it was amongst other things ordered upon the Trustee (in and by said order appointed) executing and delivering the bond required in said Order the Clerk of the said Court should execute and deliver to Thomas C Gower and Whitner Symmes (the Trustees appointed by said Order) a Deed for the lands described in Exhibit A in Plaintiffs complaint (being the lands hereinafter more particularly described) to for and upon the purposes uses and trusts recommended by the said Special Referee in reference to said lands All of which will more fully appear to the Court in said order and report of said Special Referee
