 This Indenture made
 the Fifth day of April
 in the year of our Lord One thousand eight
 hundred and seventy five between J. S.
 Southern Esquire Sheriff of Greenville County
 South Carolina of the one part, and B. F.
 Henson of the other part, witnesseth,
 Whereas William O. Moon and John Henson on
 or about the seventh day of October in the
 year of our Lord One thousand eight hundred
 and seventy four did exhibit their petition
 in the Court of Probate, at Greenville Court
 House, in the County of Greenville and State
 aforesaid against Rachel Lester and others
 claiming said Land and Partition of the Real
 Estate of Moses Easter and the Cause being at
 issue before the Honorable Court aforesaid
 came on to be heard on the Seventh day of
 November in the year of our Lord One thousand
 eight hundred and seventy four when the
 said Court after full hearing thereof and
 mature deliberation in the premises did order
 adjudge and decree that the said Real Estate
 should be sold at public Auction by the Sher-
 iff of Greenville County, South Carolina on
 the same and for the purposes mentioned in the
 decretal order in the said cause, as by refer-
 ence to the same in the registry of said Court
 will appear; and the said J. S. Southern
 as Sheriff as aforesaid, having duly
 advertised the said Tract of Land for sale
 by Public Auction on the Fifth day of
 April in the year of our Lord One thousand
 eight hundred and seventy five did then
 openly and publicly, and according to the
 Custom of Auction, sell and dispose of
 the said Tract of Land as below describ-
 ed, unto the said B. F. Henson for the
 sum of One hundred and thirty doll-
 ars he being, at that price, the highest
 bidder for the same, Now therefore this
 Indenture witnesseth, that the said J. S.
 Southern as Sheriff, as aforesaid, under and
 by virtue of the said Decree, and in consider-
 ation of the sum of One hundred and thirty
 Dollars to him paid by the said B. F. Hen-
 son the receipt whereof is hereby acknow-
 ledged, hath granted bargained sold
 and released, and by these presents doth
 grant bargain, sell and release unto the

said B. F. Henson his heirs and assigns, all
 that Tract of Land containing Eighty Six Acre
 more or less and bounded by lands of William
 Johnson and others, together with all and
 singular the rights Members hereditaments
 and appurtenances to the said Tract of
 Land (belonging or in anywise incident or app-
 ertaining) and the revenues and remainments
 issues and profits thereof; and also
 all the Estate right title interest power poss-
 ession property benefit claim and deman-
 nd whatsoever, both at law and in Equity
 of the heirs and representatives of the said
 Moses Easter and of the parties to this suit
 and of all other persons rightfully claiming
 or to claim the same or any part thereof, by
 from or under them, or either of them. They
 have and do hold the said tract of land
 with its hereditaments privileges and app-
 urtenances unto the said B. F. Henson heirs
 and assigns to him and his only proper
 use, benefit and behoof forever.
