of May A. D. 1874 Emma M.

Westfield and Whitener Synames Plaintiffs exhibited their
complaint for relief &c in the Court of Common Pleas for
the County of Greenville and State aforesaid, against
Thomas M. Cox, Thomas G. Gower, William Birnie, and
others Defendants, wherein amongst other things it
was alleged that one John Westfield now deceased, on
the 17th day of February A. D. 1873 sold and conveyed to the
