This indenture made the third day of November in the year of our Lord One thousand Eight hundred and seventy three between Jno L Southern Esquire Sheriff of Greenville County South Carolina of the one part and Solomon Dill of the other part, witnesseth: Whereas Solomon Dill on or about the first day of September in the year of our Lord One thousand Eight hundred and seventy three did exhibit his petition in the Court of Probate at Greenville Court House in the County of Greenville and State aforesaid against Asa Stator Julia Stator and others praying for a sale and partition of the Real Estate of Prudence Dill for the benefit of her legal heirs And the cause being at issue before the honorable Court aforesaid, came on to be heard on the 2^d day of October in the year of our Lord One thousand Eight hundred and seventy three when the said Court after full hearing thereof and mature deliberation in the premises did order adjudge and decree, that the Real Estate described in the Pleading consisting of One hundred and forty four Acres more or less should be sold at public Auction by the Sheriff of Greenville County South Carolina on the terms and for the purposes mentioned in the decretal order in the said cause as by reference to the same in the registry of said Court will appear and the said Jno L Southern as Sheriff as aforesaid having duly advertised the said Tract of Land for sale by public outcry on the third day of November in the year of our Lord one thousand Eight hundred and seventy three did then openly and publicly and according to the custom of auction sell and dispose of the said Tract of Land as below described unto the said Solomon Dill for the sum of Nineteen hundred Dollars he being at that time the highest bidder for the same.
