 ress, entitled "an act to establish a uniform system of bankruptcy
 throughout the United States" approved March 2, 1867 do
 hereby convey and assign to the said W. S. Shumate assignee as aforesaid
 all the estate, real and personal, of the said John L. Walk-
 er Bankrupt aforesaid, including all the property of whatever
 kind, of which he was possessed, or in which he was interest-
 ed or entitled to have, on the 1st day of February 1877, with all
 his deeds, books and papers relating thereto, excepting such prop-
 erty as is exempt from the operations of this assignment, by the
 provisions of the said fourteenth section of said act;

To have and to hold, all the foregoing premises to the said W. S.
 Shumate his heirs forever. In trust, nevertheless, for the
 use and purposes, with the powers, and subject to the conditions
 and limitations set forth in said act.
