To all to whom these presents shall come or be made known, or whom the same may in anywise concern, I, S. J. Douthick, Judge of Probate of the County of Greenville, in the said State, send greeting.

Whereas, Eliza Green on or about the 21<sup>st</sup> day of March in the year one thousand eight hundred and seventy seven did exhibit her Petition in the Court of Probate at Greenville Court House in the County of Greenville and State aforesaid, against Jane Green, Sarah Cofflin, Joann Suttin, Pleasant Green, Sapphira J. Green, John Eliza Green, Margard Stroup, Robert Green, and Mary S Jackson, and the cause being at issue before the Honorable Court aforesaid, came on to be heard on the fifth day of May one thousand eight hundred and seventy seven when the said Court, after a full hearing thereof, and mature deliberation in the premises, did order, adjudge and decree that the tract of land belonging to the estate of Pleasant Green, deceased hereinafter mentioned and described should be sold at public auction, by P. D. Gilbreath, Sheriff of Greenville County, on the

the said decretal order, as by reference thereto, on file in the said Court, will appear, and the said P. D. Together with all and singular the rights, members hereditaments, and appurtenances whatsoever, to the said tract of land belonging, or in anywise appertaining, and the reversions and remainders, rents issues and profits thereof, and also all the estate, right, title interest, dower, possession property, benefit claim and demand whatsoever, both at law and in equity, of the said Pleasant Green deceased and of all the parties to the said suit, and of all other persons rightfully claiming or to claim the same, or any part thereof, by, from or under them, or either of them; To have and to hold the said tract of land with its hereditaments privileges and appurtenances unto the said Eliza L Green her heirs and assigns forever.
