Thompkins all that tract of land situate lying and being in the County of Greenville and State aforesaid, adjoining lands of John Datterfield, William Cooper and others, and containing Ninety seven acres more or less, on the Road leading from Greenville Court House to Anderson Court House, beginning at a stake corner on the Road just above the House, thence S 34 E 39 to a small maple on a branch, up said branch to an ash corner S 69 E 75 to a stake, S 73 W 39 to a stake N 14 1/2 W 37 to a small pipe S 70 W 62 to a stake on the creek, up said creek, the high water mark being the boundary to a stake by a branch of poplars, thence N 48 E 16 to the beginning corner, Together with all and singular the rights, claims, hereditaments and appurtenances to the said premises belonging or in anywise incident or appertaining.
