Deed

The State of South Carolina Know all men by these presents that in consideration of the natural love and affection

I have for my son George Westmoreland J. L. Westmoreland of Greenville County in the State aforesaid and further in consideration of the sum of Five Dollars to me in hand paid at and before the sealing of these presents by George Westmoreland of Greenville County in the State aforesaid (the receipt whereof is hereby acknowledged) have granted bargained sold and released and by these presents do grant bargain sell and release unto the said Geo. Westmoreland all that piece parcel and tract of land situate lying and being in the State and County aforesaid about fourteen miles North of Greenville County on both sides of what is known as the State Road and adjoining lands of John Taylor Martha C. Bell J. L. Westmoreland and others and having the following notes and bounds to wit: Beginning at a stake John Taylor's corner on G.W. News line and running thence S 47° W 23.80 to stake in State Road and running thence S 21° W 23.80 to stake in State Road

thence S 60° W 19.90 to stake in Greenville Road thence S 28 1/2° W 4.34 to angle in Road thence S 38 1/2° W 9.34 to angle in Road thence S 31 1/2° W 4. to angle in Road thence S 66° W 4.68 to a stake in Road thence S 43 1/4° E 38.83 to stake near Kit Branch thence N 48° E 20.68 to stake corner of N. B. Morgan and M. C. Bell lands thence N 42° W 25 to stake thence N 48° E 40 to stake on K.W. News line thence N 43 1/2° W 17 to beginning corner containing one hundred and fifty acres more or less. I hereby reserve save and accept any and all mines of valuable mineral to me and my heirs forever. And I also reserve to myself the privilege of changing the course of the stream known as the Kit Branch so as to carry it into Beaver Dam creek for the purpose of running any machinery which I may deem proper

Together with all and singular the rights members the inheritments and appurtenances to the said premises belonging or in any wise incident or appertaining. To have and to hold all and singular the said premises before mentioned unto the said Geo. Westmoreland his heirs and assigns forever subject to the reservations hereinbefore mentioned. And I do hereby bind myself my heirs executors and administrators to warrant and defend all and singular the said premises unto the said Geo. Westmoreland his heirs and assigns against me and my heirs and all other persons who or persons lawfully claiming or to claim the same or any part thereof
