 Know all men by these presents that I Wisely Curry of the State and County aforesaid, and being sound in mind and having a disposition to make a division of my real estate between all of my children, I now make a deed of gift unto my daughter Eliza Curry of a certain piece or parcel of land lying on waters of Long Branch, a tributary of Enoree River, and situate in Greenville Co. S.C. and bounded by lands of A. B. Styles, Julia Edwards and others, commencing at poplar corner at mouth of ditch East of School house, thence South with A. B. Styles line to Julia Edwards stone corner, thence East across road to stone corner, thence North East with G. W. Fowler's line to hickory corner, thence West to red oak at road thence North with road to post oak, thence to poplar corner at spring, thence down ditch to beginning Poplar corner. Now in consideration of one dollar paid to me in hand I now make a deed of gift unto my daughter Eliza Curry of all of the above mentioned piece or parcel of land including my homestead, but I give my daughter Rachel the right to remain in my homestead with her sister Eliza so long as Rachel remains single. I now give to Eliza free use of well and water, also lot and buildings. This homestead tract not to be sold for any debt, but to remain as the property of Eliza and her heirs (if she has any) but if she dies without heirs the land is not to be sold but equally divided between my remaining children and if at her death she has no heirs the land is to remain until

the youngest child becomes of age and then sold and equally divided between her children. I reserve the above boundary of land for the support and protection of myself and Ellen Curry my wife, so long as either or both of us should live
