Coleman of Greenville County, in the State aforesaid, have granted bargained sold and released, and by these presents do grant bargain sell and release unto the said J. W. Coleman and Joseph J. Coleman all that and being parcel of land situated lying and being in the County of Greenville in the State of South Carolina
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on the Duncombe Road about twelve miles from Greenville
 Cross House and described as follows: Beginning at a P. O.,
 on said Duncombe Road and running thence N 77 1/2 W 24.00
 to stake 3 x 3 m. thence S 37 1/2 W 2.10 to a stone 3 x 3 m. thence
 S 39 1/2 W 3.30 to a stone 3 x 3 m. thence S 35 1/4 W 7.18 to stake 3 x
 3 m. thence S 36 1/2 E 31.24 to a stake 3 x 3 m. on Benson's line
 thence N 41 1/4 E 16.14 to a stone 3 x 3 m. on said Duncombe Road
