shall come, I, S. J. Donthit Master in and for the County
aforesaid, send greeting: Whereas by proceedings in the
Court of Probate for Greenville County in the State aforesaid,
in the case of Agnes Tally and others against Agnes
Stewart and others, instituted on the 31st day of August
1874 the lands hereinafter described were sold for
partition, and purchased by Joseph B. Alexander, and
whereas the said Alexander undertook to convey the
same to Samuel Mauldin, but failed to attach a
seal to his deed, and departed this life without
correcting the same, and whereas proceedings were
afterwards instituted in this Court to confirm the
proceedings in partition and to perfect the title of
said Mauldin to said lands, wherein the said Sam-
uel Mauldin was plaintiff and Caroline Thompson
(now Sibles) and the other parties in interest were
defendants, and said cause coming on for hearing
on the tenth day of April 1882 the Court did
order, adjudge and decree, that the said proceedings
in partition be confirmed and that the Master for
the County aforesaid execute and deliver a title to
the tract of land hereinafter mentioned and
described to the said Samuel Mauldin, on his
complying with the terms of his purchase.

Three thousand Dollars to me paid by the
