The State of South Carolina To all to whom these presents shall come it be made known or whom the same

may in anywise concern, I, Perry D. Gilreath, Sheriff of the County of Greenville in the said state, send greeting: Whereas, Thomas L. Gower and Whitman Symmes, Plaintiffs on or about the thirtieth day of September in the year one thousand eight hundred and seventy eight did exhibit their complaint in the Court of Common Pleas in the County of Greenville and State of aforesaid against Edward Bailey defendant, for the foreclosure of a mortgage, executed on the fifteenth day of January 1875 by Mary D. Freeman to the said Plaintiff, the payment of which mortgage the said Edward Bailey agreed to assume, at the time he bought the mortgage premises from the said Mary D.
