Deed

This Indenture made the 17th day November 1880 between Jacob Bellew of Greenville County, S. C. of the first

part, and F. D. Bellew of the same place of the second part. Whereas the said Jacob Bellew is desirous to make provision for his daughter Martha Jane Bellew and Kinder Lydia Ann Bellew against future contingencies and for their maintenance and support, and whereas the said Jacob Bellew is desirous that his daughters should enjoy the entire proceeds of his personal property and the property together with the real estate which has already been deeded to them free from the control, liabilities or interference of any husband that they may hereafter have. Now therefore this indenture witnesseth that the said Jacob Bellew in consideration of the premises and of the sum of one dollar lawful money of the United States to him in hand paid by the said party of the second part, the receipt whereof is hereby acknowledged, hath bargained, sold, aliened, conveyed and delivered unto the party of the second part one young black mare, one red cow one white spotted heifer, one sow and two shoats and all their increase three feather beds and all my household and kitchen furniture of every kind, all the crops of corn, cotton, fodder, &c. that I now have or may hereafter have and all my personal property of a

description that I now own or may hereafter become possessed of, to have and to hold all and singular the above described property unto the said F. D. Bellew, in trust for the future use benefit and behoof of my two daughters as above named, and the said Jacob Bellew hereby declares that upon the decease of either of his daughters Martha Jane Bellew or Kinder Lydia Ann Bellew her part shall revert to the surviving daughter, unless deceased has children, if so then they shall take their mother part absolutely and the said party of the second part doth hereby signify his acceptance of this trust and doth hereby covenant and agree to and with the said party of the first part faithfully to discharge and execute the same according to the true intent and meaning of these presents.
