Bradley Executrix of the Estate of Curtis Bradley deceased did on the 19<sup>th</sup> day of August 1879 make and deliver to us Arnoldus Bradley and Joseph Bradley a deed of conveyance of a certain tract of land, the same being a part of the Real Estate of the said Curtis Bradley deceased, and more particularly described by said deed - said conveyance being made in settlement of certain notes and judgment which we the said Arnoldus Bradley and Joseph Bradley held against the Estate of the said Curtis Bradley deceased, and whereas it was then & there understood and agreed between the said parties to said deed that the said Minerva Bradley should have a life Estate in said lands during the natural term of her life, and whereas by mistake such provision was by mistake left out the said deed, now therefore in consideration of the sum of one dollar to us in hand paid by the said Minerva Bradley we do hereby grant bargain sell and release unto the said Minerva Bradley a life interest and Estate in and to the said lands to have and to hold all and singular the premises before mentioned unto the said Minerva Bradley for and during the term of her natural life, and we do hereby bind ourselves our heirs executors and administrators to warrant and forever defend all and singular the said premises unto the said Minerva Bradley for & during the term of her natural life against every person who may lawfully claim or to claim the same, or any part thereof the said Estate after the death of the said Minerva Bradley reverting to ourselves.

Gilliard by Deed dated the 5<sup>th</sup> day of May 1853 and recorded in office of Register of mensur conveyance Book 11, page 53 recorded the 4<sup>th</sup> day of June 1853 Together with all and singular the rights members hereditaments and appurtenances to the said premises belonging, or in anywise incident or appertaining, to have and to hold all and singular the premises and the same
