South, in consideration of the sum of Ten dollars  
to us paid by Miss Mary E. Payne of Greenville  
County in the State aforesaid, have granted barg-  
ained, sold and released and by these presents  
do grant bargain sell and release unto the said  
Miss Mary E. Payne, all that piece parcel and lot  
of land containing one and one half acres more or  
less situate lying and being in Greenville County in  
the State aforesaid on both sides of the old Stanton  
Bridge Road, and adjoining land on all sides by  
said Miss Payne, the same being a portion of a two  
acre lot conveyed to the Trustees of said Salem  
Church by Joshua Thompson by deed, for the use  
and benefit of a church and upon which Salem  
Church was originally built - The other half half  
acre of said two acre lot being reserved by said  
Trustees for the use and benefit of a burying ground  
and set off and marked out by J. N. Southern D.S.  
the 24<sup>th</sup> day of May A.D. 1882 Together with all  
singular the rights, members, hereditaments and  
appurtenances to the said premises belonging, or in  
anywise incident or appertaining. To have  
and to hold all and singular the said premises  
before mentioned unto the said Mary E. Payne  
her heirs and assigns forever, and we do  
hereby bind ourselves and our successors in  
office to warrant and forever defend the said  
premises unto the said Mary E. Payne her heirs and  
assigns against us and our successors in office

thereof.
