- Articles of the Constitution of the Wesley Chapel
 Union Society.
- Article I. This association shall be known as
 the Wesley Chapel Union Association for per-
 sons of good character.
 - Article II. This Society shall be open with sing-
 ing and prayer, and reading the Holy Scrip-
 tures.
 - Article III. The object of this Society shall be to
 the development of character, of all who shall
 become members of it, and protect and defend
 each other so far as consistent with truth.
 - Article IIII. in cases of sickness with any of the
 members of this Society, they shall take and
 interest in visiting them and sitting up
 with them until they are better.
 - Article V. We do resolve that when a mem-
 ber of this Society dies, they shall and will
 be buried by the Society, and a badge of
 mourning shall be worn XX days by every
 member of this association.
 - Article VI. Any person approved by the mem-
 bers of this Association may become con-
 nected therewith by attaching his or her name
 to the Usury and paying into the Treasurer
 the sum of \$100.00. Admitted on the 1st of June
 - Article VII. the officers of this association
 shall consist of a president and three
 President and 3 Secretaries, 3 Trustees, Treas-
 urer, 3 Stewards, 3 Visiting Committee, 3 Report-
 ers, 1 Warden, 1 Forth.
