Harrison of Sumner County in the State aforesaid, in consideration of the love and affection which I have for my wife and children as well as the sum of Three Dollars to me in hand paid by Mannie E. Harrison of Sumner County in the State aforesaid, have granted, bargained, sold and released, and by these presents do grant, bargain, sell and release unto the said Mannie E. Harrison and her bodily heirs legitimate of me, all that piece or parcel and tract of land containing Two hundred and eighty Six acres more or less, Situate lying and being in the County and State aforesaid on Cripple Creek of Rudy River adjoining lands of S. E. Harrison and Richard Harrison and others and hath the following metes and bounds: Beginning at a Stone on the Indian Bridge Road and running thence North 22 1/2 degrees East 20.87. Thence North 61 1/4 degrees East to a Stone 31. Thence North 20 1/4 degrees East 15.32 to a Stone 31. Thence North 24 degrees 15.83 across Cripple Creek to a Stone 31. Thence South 29 degrees 20.70 to a Stone 31 on said Creek, thence down the Creek as a line to a Stone 31 in the mouth of a branch, Thence South 61 degrees 20.70 to a Stone 31 in the Indian Bridge Road. Thence said road to the Beginning. Also, on this tract containing Fourteen acres more or less lying on the South side of said Creek when it enters into Rudy River, Beginning at a Red Oak 31 on the River and running thence South 22 1/2 degrees East 16.35 to a Stone 31.
