Together with all and singular the Rights, Members, Rendiments and appurtenances to the said premises including or in any wise incident or appertaining to them and to hold, all and singular the premises forever unto the said Thomas Price (Col'd) his heirs and assigns forever. And I to him by him and myself my heirs, Executors and Administrators to warrant and forever defend all and singular the said premises unto the said Thomas Price his heirs and assigns, against myself and my heirs and every other person whomsoever lawfully claiming or to claim the same in any part thereof.
