McCullough, Henry Stokes Jr. and others, and containing One hundred and seventeen acres more or less. Together with all and singular the Rights, Members, Hereditaments and appurtenances to the said premises, belonging, or in any wise incident, or appertaining; and all the estate, rights, title, claims, and interests whatsoever, of the parties to the Cause aforesaid, and of each of them in and to the same; and of all other persons rightfully claiming, from, under, or by, these or any of them. To have and to hold, all and singular the premises before mentioned, unto the said P. Eugene Stokes his heirs and assigns forever.
