

that, whereas George Greer late of Greenville County and State of Georgia departed this life intestate and undebted in the year 1868 seized and possessed of two tracts of land, one containing 101 Acres and the other 96 Acres, in all 197 Acres, which has ever since remained in the possession of his widow, Delila Greer and whereas the said George Greer died testate surviving him as his heirs at law, and distributed to his widow (Delila Greer), and eight children, to wit: Daniel M. Greer, James Greer, Cornelia Bridwell, Mary Priestley, G. W. Greer, W. H. Greer, S. M. Greer and Pauline Pickens, all of whom are above the age of twenty years, and whereas no partition or division of said real estate has ever been had, and being desirous to have the same divided without recourse to the Court, and whereas the said real estate was surveyed at their request and by the consent of all parties in interest on the 2nd day of December 1884 by James H. Dickson D. S. and by him cut into nine different tracts as follows, to wit: Tract No. 1 containing 27 Acres, Tract No. 2 containing 20 Acres, Tract No. 3 containing 19 Acres, Tract No. 4 containing 20 Acres, Tract No. 5 containing 20 Acres, Tract No. 6 containing 19 Acres, Tract No. 7 containing 19 1/4 Acres, Tract No. 8 containing 20 Acres, Tract No. 9 containing 20 Acres, each tract having the metes and boundaries, course and distances, as shown by the plots of said survey, marked Nos. 1, 2, 3, 4, 5, 6, 7, 8 and 9 of which is hereto attached, and whereas by consent of all parties in interest Tract No. 1 was assigned to Delila Greer (widow), Tract No. 2 was assigned to Daniel M. Greer, Tract No. 3 was assigned to W. H. Greer, Tract No. 4 was assigned to James Greer, Tract No. 5 was assigned to Mary Priestley, Tract No. 6 was assigned to G. W. Greer, Tract No. 7 was assigned to Pauline Pickens, Tract No. 8 was assigned to G. H. Greer, Tract No. 9 was assigned to Cornelia Bridwell and each put in possession of the tract assigned to him or her
