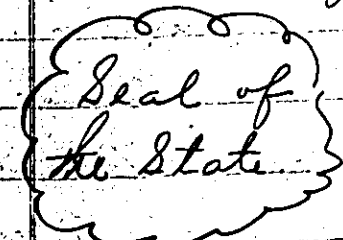

 By the Secretary of State.
 Whereas, L. M. McBee, J. H. Morgan and J. A. McDaniel, did, on the seventh day of March 1888 file with the Secretary of State a written declaration, signed by themselves, setting forth: First: The name and residences of the said petitioners to be L. M. McBee, J. H. Morgan and J. A. McDaniel all of whom are residents of the City of Greenville State of South Carolina. Second: The name of the proposed corporation to be that of "Greenville Pants Manufacturing Company" its principal place of business to be at the City of Greenville in the State of South Carolina its general purpose and the nature of the business of said proposed corporation to be that of Manufacturing Pants, Drawers, Overalls, Shirts, Vests, Coats, Over Coats and everything pertaining to Gents clothing and furnishing goods. Third: The amount of Capital Stock to be Ten Thousand (\$10,000) Dollars with privilege of increasing same to twenty thousand Dollars and the number of Shares into which the same is to be divided to be Two hundred Shares of the par value of fifty Dollars each, with the privilege of increasing the number of Shares to correspond with the increasing of amount of Capital Stock as above set forth.
