third day of January 1890, file with the Secretary of State a written declaration signed by themselves, setting forth: First: The names and residences of the said petitioners to be Walter S. Gray, John D. Sullivan, J. E. Ware, and Samuel J. Pickle, all of Greenville, South Carolina, Second: The name of the proposed Corporation to be that of "The Greenville Supply Company" and the place at which it proposes to have its principal place of business is Greenville South Carolina; the general purpose and nature of the business it proposes to do is as follows: the buying and selling of goods, wares and Merchandise, fertilizers, cotton, mules and horses, wagons and buggies, land and any other class of property; that the Directors deem to the interest of the Corporation, the lending of money and the discounting of paper Third: The amount of Capital Stock to be twenty five thousand Dollars, and the number of shares into which the same is to be divided to be five hundred and fifty shares of the par value of one hundred Dollars per share, and whereas on the third day of January 1890, the said Walter S. Gray, John D. Sullivan, J. E. Ware and Samuel J. Pickle were commissioned by me as Notary Public of said County authorizing and empowering them to do the above and
