Campbell (all that tract piece or parcel of land lying and being in Greenville County, and State aforesaid and in Grove Township and being a part of my recent home place and known as tract No. three in a recent plat made by J. M. Curstun D. S. on March 8<sup>th</sup> 1893. and containing twenty five (25) acres more or less and has the following marks bearings and distances, Beginning on a stone 3x4 in on the Piedmont road thence S 24 1/2 W. 19.50 to a stone (originally a Chestnut) 3x4 in thence N 24 1/2 E. 32.50 to a willow stake on branch 3x4 in thence down mean survey of said branch to a Poplar 3x4 in at bearing corner and adjoining lands of S. A. Mims and J. W. Shackleton and others)

To Have with all and singular the rights member hereunto and appertinances to the said premises belonging or in anywise incident or appertaining.

To Have and to hold all and singular the said premises hereunto with the said John W. Campbell his heirs and assigns forever.

I exempt and reserve one acre of land which has been surveyed and set off by J. M. Curstun D. S. as a family burying ground and refer to plat made by the said Surveyor on March 8<sup>th</sup> 1893.

And I do hereby bind myself my heirs executors and administrators to warrant and forever defend all and singular the said premises unto the said John W. Campbell his heirs and assigns
