Dickson, Sr., and dated September, 1884; said plat is recorded in Clerk's office. I send also to the Church above named, for its benefit, according to Will of said deceased, two beds and bed-steads, two bureaus, one brass case, one wardrobe, one wash stand, bowl and fitcher, six chairs, two rocking chairs, one set Andiron and fender, two tables and one cruet. (portion of the above mentioned personal property being now in the possession of Green Ingram and used by him.)

Together with all and singular the rights, members, hereditaments and appurtenances to the said premises belonging or in anywise incident or appertaining, together with the above mentioned personal property. To have and to hold all and singular the said premises and other property before mentioned unto the said John W. Walker, Dr. B. D. Dew, T. J. Goodlett, Dr. B. D. Goodlett and John W. Kendrick, Trustees of Jackson Grove Methodist Church, and to their successors in office forever. And I do hereby bind myself, as Executor of said Sarah Ingram, dead, my heirs, Executors and administrators, to warrant and forever defend all and singular the said premises unto the said John W. Walker, Dr. B. D. Dew, T. J. Goodlett, Dr. B. D. Goodlett and John W. Kendrick, Trustees of said Jackson Grove Methodist Church, and to their successors in office forever.
