 West of the first part, and A. D. Rhodes of the second part,
 both parties of the State and County aforesaid, Viz:

Party of the first part has this day rented his plantation,
 (lying in Greenville County and known as the Geo. Thacker plantation
 place, bounded by lands of J. J. West, Geo. Thacker & others,)
 to the said A. D. Rhodes for the year 1894, beginning Jan. 1st,
 1894, for the sum of fifteen hundred pounds of middling
 Lick Cotton, free up in good merchantable bales and to be com-
 dore on or by Nov. 1st, 1894 and delivered to J. J. West on the said
 above place, said party of the second part shall keep said
 plantation in good shape and open out all terraces and
 ditches and keep same in proper condition for the proper ad-
 vancement of all crops grown and gathered thereon. Second,
 D. A. D. Rhodes, party of the second part, to the above contract,
 do hereby agree to same in each and every point and particular
 and bind myself to strictly adhere to same, and to deliver the
 fifteen hundred pounds of middling Lick Cotton in the condition
 as stated above on or by Nov. 1st, 1894, to said J. J. West, for
 receipt of said sum for year 1894.

Whereas one William West was adjudged a
 bankrupt some time in the year 1871 and his home tract
 of land was assigned by the adjudication in bankruptcy
 to the assignee appointed by the Court, A. Blythe, who sold
 the same under order of the Court and the same was purchased
 by William E. Carter. And whereas subsequently there a petition
 was filed in the bankruptcy Court by the assignee, A. Blythe,
 asking permission of the Court to carry out a compromise as
 to another tract of land being substituted for the home place,
 and the home place conveyed to such person as the said
 William West may choose. And whereas, on the 29th
 October, 1872, an order was passed on said petition, which
 order is as follows:
