Encroachments and affronts as well as injuries belonging or in anywise incident or pertaining to said and to hold all and singular the said premises before mentioned unto the said William B. Wright his heirs and assigns forever subject however to the limitations and conditions herein before imposed, and it shall be the duty of self and its Successors in office to prosecute and defend all and singular the said premises unto the said William B. Wright his heirs and assigns against itself and its Successors in office lawfully claiming or to claim the same or any part thereof.
