Whereas on Oct. 7th 1893, Isaac M. Bryan, executed to George A. Norwood, as Trustee his certain deed of mortgage to secure certain debts therein specified and conveying the tract of land in the City of Greenville, in the County and State aforesaid, at the corner of Buncombe and Frank Streets containing nine acres more or less and more particularly described in said mortgage which is duly recorded in the A.
