Know all men by these presents that the City Council of Greenville in the State aforesaid for and in consideration of the sum of Forty Dollars to it in hand paid at and before the sealing of these presents by John C. Bailey, the receipt whereof is duly acknowledged have granted, sold, conveyed and released, and by these presents do grant, bargain, sell and release unto the said John C. Bailey, lot No 27 1/2 31 1/2 of Springwood Cemetery having the following dimensions: To wit: West 12 1/2 feet, East 23 feet, North 24 feet South 22 feet for the use of burial and cemetery purposes & to be used exclusively for the right and purpose aforesaid, and subject to the conditions of the Charter of said grantor and all revisions thereof and Amendments that may be made thereto and also subject to the Ordinances of said City and the rules regulations and by-laws of the City Council and Cemetery Trustees or Committee now in force or which may hereafter be passed, relating to said Cemetery and the burial of the dead therein together with all and singular the rights, franchises, liberties, immunities and appurtenances to said premises belonging or in anywise incident or otherwise to have and to hold all and singular the said premises before mentioned unto the said John C. Bailey his heirs and assigns forever. Subject however to the limitations and conditions hereinafter expressed. And it ever lawfully bind itself and its Successors in office to acknowledge and forever defend all and singular the said premises unto the said John C. Bailey his heirs and assigns against itself and its Successors in office, lawfully claiming or to claim the same or any part thereof. Witness the hand of said City Council of Greenville this 23rd day of January A.D. 1898. in the year of our Lord one thousand eight hundred and ninety eight and in the 27th year of the Liberty and Independence of the United States of America.
