A. Lewis in the State aforesaid, the receipt whereof is hereby acknowledged, have granted bargained, sold and released, and by these Presents do grant bargain sell and release unto the said R. A. Lewis, all our respective interests in ~~all~~ that certain piece parcel or tract of land situate in Darlington Township, Greenville County, South Carolina, and containing Seventy seven acres more or less, bounded by lands of Estate John C. Cathers, Ira A. Williams, Willis W. Seaborn, and others, and having metes and bounds as follows: - Beginning on a stone 3x, thence N 85° W 14.50 to a stone 3x, thence S 3 1/2° E 37.40 to a hickory 3x, thence S 41° W 30.00 to a stone 3x, thence N 67 1/2° E 14.77 to stone 3x, thence N 1/2° W 59.90 to the beginning corner, being the same land conveyed to R. A. Lewis & Co. by Willis W. Seaborn by deed dated Nov. 26th 1894, and recorded at Greenville C. H. S.C. in the Register of Munc. Conveyance office in Book B. B.
