

Plats, old and new, bordering upon it are continuous over almost its entire length. Many miles of it may be easily followed, even through cleared fields without the aid of an instrument.

With all this evidence before me, I decide that it is the true line and herewith submit my report to that effect. The accompanying map will show the whole work in detail.
