Whereas by an act of the General  
Assembly of the State of South Carolina  
entitled An Act in relation to Forfeited  
Lands, Delinquent Lands and Collection of  
Taxes, approved December 24th 1887 and Acts  
Amendatory thereof it is provided that immediately  
upon the expiration of the time allowed  
by law for the payment of taxes in any year  
the County Treasurer of each County shall  
issue in the name of the State, a warrant  
or execution against each defaulting tax-  
payer in his County directed to the Sheriff or  
his lawful deputy, requiring and commanding  
him to lay the same by distress and sale of  
so much of the tax-payer's estate real or personal  
or both as may be sufficient to satisfy the  
taxes State School money and fees of such  
defaulters; and further, that notice and by virtue
