the receipt whereof is hereby acknowledged, HAVE GRANTED, bargained, sold, and released, and by these presents DO GRANT, bargain, sell, and release unto the said

John D. Harris, — All that tract of land situate, lying and being in Grove Township in the County and State aforesaid, adjoining land of John Brown, William West and others, and containing one hundred and sixty-four acres, more or less, being the same tract of land decreed to H. D. Harris by J. D. Southern, Sheriff of Greenville County on the third day of November 1878, said deed being recorded in R. M. C. Office Book 35 page 198.

TOGETHER with all and singular the Rights, Members, Hereditaments and Appurtenances to the said premises belonging, or in anywise incident or appertaining; and all the estate, right, title, claim, and interest whatsoever, of the parties to the cause aforesaid, and of each of them, in and to the same; and of all other persons rightfully claiming from, under, or by these or any of them.

TO HAVE AND TO HOLD, all and singular the premises before mentioned, unto the said

John D. Harris his heirs and assigns forever.
