The State of South Carolina,

Know all men by these presents that I Joseph Brookshire of Greenville County in the State aforesaid for and in consideration of the sum of Twenty five Dollars to me in hand paid by the Paris Mountain Water Company, a corporation of said State the receipt whereof is hereby acknowledged, have granted, bargained, sold and released, and by these presents do grant, bargain, sell, release and set over to the said The Paris Mountain Company, its successors and assigns forever, a right-of-way for the purpose of laying its pipes and conduits for the conveyance of water through and over that piece parcel and tract of land situate lying and being in said State and County, adjoining lands of J. H. Boling W. A. Boling James Dogan and others, being my family homestead and the place whereon I now live, said pipes and conduits to extend from a point near the Mountain Creek Road and pass between my dwelling house and stables along the line heretofore determined upon by said Company, with the full right-power and privilege to the said The Paris Mountain Water Company its successors, agents, servants and assigns to enter upon and pass over said tract of land whenever necessary, and performing such work and making such excavations fillings levelling paving and repairing as may be necessary for the purpose of laying said pipes and conduits and keeping the same in repair,

And I do hereby bind myself, my heirs, executors administrators and assigns to warrant and forever defend the easement hereby granted unto the said The Paris Mountain Water Company its successors and assigns forever,
