Ashby as individuals and as partners under the firm name and style of Ashby and Son, of the City and County of Greenville in the State aforesaid in consideration of the sum of Two - Thousand Dollars, to us, paid by the "Greenville Gas and Electric Light and Power Company" a corporation duly chartered under the laws of the State of South Carolina, have granted bargained, sold and released and do hereby grant bargain all and release unto the said "Greenville Gas Electric Light and Power Company," its successors and assigns, all that piece parcel or tract of land, situate lying and being in the city of Greenville and County of Greenville and State aforesaid, containing fifty-two rods more or less. Also all that other piece parcel and lot of land, situate lying and being in the Fourth Ward of the city of Greenville, County and State aforesaid.
