

of said rent as shall equal the account shall be further upon offset against the same, and receipt for as herein provided. And it is further agreed that in case the building aforesaid shall, without any fault or neglect on his part, be destroyed or be so injured by the elements, or any other cause, as to be untenantable and unfit for the purpose for which it may be used as an Opera House, the party of the second part shall not be bound to pay rent to the party of the first part, for the time after such destruction or injury, and may thereupon quit and surrender this lease.

And the said party of the second part covenants to pay to the party of the first part the said rent, as herein specified, and that at the expiration of said term, or other determination of said lease, the said party of the second party will quit and surrender the said premises hereby demised in as good state and condition as reasonable use and wear thereof will permit, damages by the elements and destruction and injury as hereinbefore stipulated excepted, and the said party of the first part covenants that the said party of the second part, on paying the rent as provided and performing all other covenants agreed by him, shall and may peaceably and quietly have, hold and enjoy the said demised premises for the term aforesaid.

In witness whereof the party of the first part has caused its corporate seal to be affixed hereto and has caused its President and Treasurer and Vice President and Secretary to sign the same, and the party of the second part does hereby set his hand seal, all the day and year first above written.

O. Cauble (the receipt whereof is hereby acknowledged), have granted, bargained, sold and released, and by these presents Do Grant, bargain, sell and release unto the said J. O. Cauble Lot No. 95 of Springwood Cemetery having the following dimensions, to wit: East 18 feet, North 15 feet, South 12 feet, West 18 feet for the right of burial and cemetery purposes, and to be used exclusively for the right of purpose aforesaid, and subject to the conditions of the Charter of said Grantor, and all revisions thereof and amendments that may be made thereto, and also subject to the Ordinances of the City and the rules, regulations and by-laws of the City Council and Cemetery Trustees or Committee, now in force, or which may hereafter be passed, relating to said Cemetery and the burial of the dead therein.

Together with all and singular the rights, Members, Hereditaments, and Appurtenances to said premises belonging or in anywise appertaining or incident. TO HAVE AND TO HOLD, all and singular the -said premises before mentioned unto the said J. O. Cauble his heirs and assigns forever; subject, however, to the limitations and conditions hereinbefore imposed.

And it does hereby bind itself and its successors in office to warrant and forever defend all and singular the said premises unto the said J. O. Cauble, his Heirs and Assigns, against itself and its successors in office, lawfully claiming, or to claim the same, or any part thereof.

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Robert D. Mayes, M. C. Abramay, D. B. Bent, and John McEward, a majority of the Board of Directors of Consolidated Telephone Company, of South Carolina, a corporation created under and pursuant to the laws of South Carolina, by certificate issued under the hand of the Secretary of State and the Great Seal of South Carolina on the 2nd day of June, A.D. 1899, have certified certain signatures Resolutions Authorizing in behalf of the aforesaid corporation an increase in the capital stock (Authorizing a cut set forth in the certificate of issue) to the sum of Three Hundred Thousand (\$300,000) Dollars, which Resolution was adopted pursuant to law, at a meeting of the stockholders of the aforesaid corporation, of which thirty days publishing notice was given, which notice stated the purpose of the abovesaid meeting, and further that said Resolution was adopted by a two-thirds vote, and that in all respects there has been complied with the provisions of "An Act to Provide for the Increase and Decrease of the Capital Stock of Corporations in the State, Except Railroad, Banking, Tramway, Turnpike and Canal corporations," approved March 1st A.D. 1899.
