BY THE SECRETARY OF STATE.

WHEREAS, J. W. McOain and W. F. Henderson, both of Greenville, S.C., did on the 14th, day of March, 1901 file with the Secretary of State a written Declaration, signed by themselves, setting forth:

FIRST: The names and residences of the said petitioners to be as above given.

SECOND: The name of the proposed corporation to be that of THE GREENVILLE BANKING COMPANY,

THIRD: The principal place of business of the corporation will be Greenville, S.C.

FOURTH: The general purpose of the corporation, and the nature of business it proposes to do.

FIFTH: The amount of the capital stock to be SIXTEEN THOUSAND DOLLARS, and the number of shares into which the same is to be divided to be one hundred and sixty of the par value of one hundred dollars each.

SIXTH: The capital stock to be payable as set fourth in the Declaration.

AND WHEREAS, on the 14th. of March, 1902 the date above named, petitioners were commissioned by me a Board of Corporators;

AND WHEREAS, the said Board of Corporators, on the 25th. day of March, 1902, did file with the Secretary of State their return in writing, over their signatures, certifying, among other things, that pursuant to published notice as required in the commission of the said Corporators, the books of subscription to the capital stock of the aforesaid Company were duly opened, and that thereupon exceeding fifty per centum of the capital stock was subscribed by bona fide stockholders; that thereupon a meeting of stockholders was called, and the aforesaid Company duly organized by the election of a Board of Directors, and other necessary officers. That, furthermore, they have complied with all the requirements of an Act of the general Assembly of the State of South Carolina, entitled "An Act to Provide for the Formation of Certain Corporations and to Define the Powers Thereof," approved the ninth day of March, A.D. 1896, and all Acts amendatory thereto.

NOW, THEREFORE, I, M. R. COOPER, Secretary of State, by virtue of the authority in me vested by the aforesaid Act, and Acts amendatory thereto, do hereby certify that the said Company has been fully organized according to the laws of South Carolina, under the name and for the purpose indicated in their written declaration, and that they are fully authorized to commence business under their charter; and I do hereby direct that a copy of this certificate be filed and recorded in the office of the Register of Meane Conveyance in each county where such Corporation shall have a business office.

KNOW ALL MEN BY THESE PRESENTS,

THAT I, W. H. Irvine of Greenville, in the State aforesaid, for and in consideration of One Dollar to me paid by the Paris Mountain Water Company, a Corporation organized under the laws of and doing business in the State aforesaid, the receipt of which is hereby acknowledged, and in further consideration of the privilege of getting water on my place hereinafter mentioned from the pipes of said Water Company on as reasonable terms as the same is furnished to other persons, have granted, bargained and sold, and do hereby grant, bargain and sell unto the said Paris Mountain water Company, its Successors and Assigns a Right of Way over my tract of land in Greenville Township, Greenville County and State aforesaid, adjoining lands of John B. Marshall, L. F. Goldsmith, and others, for the purpose of laying their pipes or conduits, to conduct water from or near Paris Mountain, in said County, to City of Greenville, S. C. with the privilege of entering upon the same and making such excavations, fills and levels as may be requisite and the privilege of laying such pipe or pipes or other conduits as they may deem necessary, and of making such repairs and laying other pipes as may from time to time be necessary, such pipes or conduits to, be approximately located along the line recently surveyed by the said Paris Mountain Water Company, running -----feet in a South-westerly direction, to have and to hold such right of way and privileges for the purposes aforesaid unto the said Paris Mountain Water Company, its Successors and Assigns for ever.
